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### **STAGE SETUP**

Far Stage Left: is a Park Bench or Bar table

Center Stage: Up to Left Center – Elevator Door to Floors of Apartment complex

**Audience Chairs:** 4-5 rows of chairs 10-15 across. There is an aisle down the center.

### **LIGHTING SETUP**

**HOUSE LIGHTS:** Flood lights bouncing off ceiling (so they can be controlled from the booth)

**MEETING LIGHTS:** Fill lights covering the downstage stage right to center

**ELEVATOR LIGHTS:** Fill lights covering center stage center to center left

**BAR LIGHTS:** Fill lights – Far Stage Left

**SPOTS:** Individual Spot lights and specific characters

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### Act 1, Scene 1

Place: Marblehead Manor

<u>Time</u>: The present

Occasion: Monthly Meeting with Residents Timing: A few minutes prior to the meeting...

#### **HOUSE LIGHTS UP FULL**

(10 minutes before the start, Steve Girton, Craig Austin, Lulu and Victor Enter and sit in reserved seats intermixed in the audience.)

(Start of Scene, David walks in up the center aisle)

**DAVID**: Hey LULU, I see you've parked yourself in the front row again. PLEASE...no mumbling and grumbling this time.

(David sits at the chair farthest stage right at the desk.)

**LULU:** David, don't take a snooze after the first five minutes. What's worse, my constructive comments or you're loud snoring?!

**CRAIG:** There they go again. Nobody would guess they're Bridge partners every Wednesday.

**STEVE:** Ol' David once belonged to the American Historical Society. And Lulu?, more like the **Hysterical** Society!

(Lulu gives Steve a razzle hand sign)

**CRAIG:** If opposites attract, they'd be glued to each other.

**VICTOR:** Gertrude, can you take off your hat. I want to see this.

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**GERTRUDE:** See what?

**VICTOR:** The Meeting!

**GERTRUDE:** This is my favorite musical, when I go to the theater, I

always wear a hat.

(Sarah Sizemore and Betsy Love enter the room stage right door and setup up their notebooks and chairs at the table. Sarah positions a gavel on the desk and sits at the center of the table. Betsy is to her left, David is to her right.)

**LULU:** Is that where you hide the tomatoes to throw at the actors?

**SARAH:** (*To Betsy*) Betsy, I am only telling you this, I saw the budget...

(This perks David's attention and he leans over to listen to the conversation)

**SARAH:** and they are getting ready to have major cut backs here and may be even selling the place.

**BETSY:** I hope they don't cut my job, without this income I am in a pickle.

**SARAH:** Don't worry, I'll resign before I let them cut your job. Let's just keep this conversation between us. I'm going to hate to tell the residence, you know how they hate change.

**BETSY:** My lips are sealed, which is more that I can say about Lulu.

**SARAH:** Let's get the meeting started. (*She stands*)

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### Act 1, Scene Two

### **MEETING LIGHTS UP FULL**

(Sarah Sizemore taps her gavel three times. The audience members continue talking and ignoring the gavel sound.)

**SARAH:** I would like to call this meeting of the monthly Marblehead Manor Residents to order..... (*She hits the gavel 3 times*)

(The audience continues to make talking sound)

**SARAH:** Hello, Hello, (she gets louder, audience still ignores her) HELLO! (She yells, the audience starts to pay attention) As you know, I'm Sarah Sizemore the Manager of Marblehead Manor and this of course, is Betsy Love, my able Assistant Manager. We hope you are all well and enjoying your living here at the Manor.

**LULU:** (*In an overly load voice*) Are you going to be serving drinks afterwards? If not I am out of here!

**SARAH:** (calming her down) As I was saying...

**CRAIG:** (to Lulu) You fly, I'll Buy...

**GERTRUDE:** Craig, you can't fly with your heart condition....

**SARAH:** OK, Ok, I would call upon David Derbyshire, our Secretary and to go over the rules and recall last meetings minutes:

**DAVID:** (*He stands up at the desk*)

Thank you Sarah. (*Clears throat, Pauses dramatically*) Before we start our meeting, I would like go to over the rules as stated in article 5, paragraph 2 in the Marble Head Manor bi-laws revised edition 2011. It states, there shall be no flash photography, all cell phones must be set to

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silence or turned off, under penalty of being pointed out for public ridicule or being cast in the next performance. Whatever that means?

**SONG:** "MARBLEHEAD MANOR" (David, Sarah, Betsy, Craig, Steve, Lulu, Victor)

(Musical intro... 12 bars)

**DAVID:** No playing video games, no live animals in the meeting, no public displays of affection, no drinking of alcoholic beverages until after the meeting. No Wheelchairs parked in the lobby. No smoking of any kind, including "Medicinal" or otherwise. You must end the meeting with same clothes you started with. (*He then going into a high pitched gibberish, of minutes of the last meeting with real words, like cigarettes, bath robes, underwear, slippers, monkey bars, dentures also all walkers, canes, rollators, wheelchairs, power wheelchairs need to be put in the hallway, Along the way during the music breaks he says, Slip n Slides, Bungie Cords, Fish Nets, ...he will fade off and song will start.)*

I love the peace and quiet here And meet the people needs The old men hit on me, which creeps me out (spoken)

(Music - 4 measures)

### **SPOT LIGHT - LULU**

#### LuLu:

I'll admit I drink a bit It helps me relax And to forget

About my son Became a judge Now he runs my life From Texas

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I know most of the people here
Think I might be nuts
Although I might be the only sane one here...(line finishes almost spoken)

(Music - 4 measures)

### **SPOT LIGHT - VICTOR**

#### Victor:

A resident

For two years now

Moved in here when my wife had gone

I'm settled here
And I love to try
To entertain this big family

I love to see the people smile
I hope that they can see
I'm making it up as I go along (line finishes almost spoken)

(Music - 4 measures)

### **SPOT LIGHT - CRAIG**

#### **Craig:**

My mind is sharp That hasn't changed The body though's a bad deal

I hope that I can just keep up With how I want to be

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It's just that I'm tired out now after 8 o'clock (line finishes almost spoken)

(Music - 4 measures)

#### **SPOT LIGHT - STEVE**

#### **Steve:**

Just got here Few months ago Don't ask me why I don't know

Much of my life Seems unfulfilled I'm not finished yet Just simplified

I got a couple good friends here
That makes me feel young
I'm looking for that happy ending (line finishes almost spoken)

(Music - 6 measures)

#### All:

(Musical ending - 1 bar)

#### MEETING LIGHTS UP FULL

**DAVID:** (Fades back louder in same high pitched sound) faithfully submitted, I, David Derbyshire, Secretary of Marblehead Manor Residents Association Inc.

**SARAH:** Thank you David. Do we have a motion to accept the minutes.

LULU: Oh god yes.

**GERTRUDE:** I thought this was a musical, now it's a meeting?

**SARAH:** And a second.

**CRAIG:** Why not.

**SARAH:** All those in favor, say "I"

(Crowd "I")

**SARAH**: Opposed, same sign.

**GERTRUDE:** (Standing up)"I".....

**LULU:** (Pulling her down) It ain't over yet.

**CRAIG:** (Stands up) Hey, it ain't over till it's over.... (Sits down)

**BETSY:** After the business part of the meeting, we will have entertainment and a big special announcement for all the residents. For our entertainment we have a treat for you ... Our very own sassy songstress, Ms. Sarah Sizemore (*Pointing to Sarah*) will sing a selected

song for us. (Long pause as she clears her throat...) also, once again...our own resident Victor Vernon (Victor will stand and look happy) will entertain us with a New Act.

**LULU:** Is he going to try to pull that damn rabbit out of his hat again. Couldn't he pull out something more useful like Chips and Salsa and Margaritas?

**DAVID:** Didn't the rabbit get loose last time.

**GERTRUDE:** There's a rabbit loose? I've seen rabbits.

**STEVE:** At least we know it was not in the potted plant. (*Victor sits looking dejected*)

**SARAH:** (*She Stands*) Victor keeps improving with each performance er a... Last time, he performed his magic act and the mishap with Mrs. Shimsky nearly getting sawed-in-two!

**VICTOR:** (*He interrupts*) She didn't listen to directions!

**SARAH:** I hear word that she has decided not to leave us and she is doing much better. We did have to replace all of the potted plants in response to the "Rabbit" incident.

(Victor looks dejected)

**BETSY:** (*She stands*) Victor has always aspired to be in show biz. Well, never say never, I guess. (*Sarah sits*) Any of you can perform after our regular meetings, you know.

**GERTRUDE:** (She Jump Up) I can entertain. (She begins to Tap Dance and stops) When I was younger, I used to dance and "Sing in the Rain" with Gene Kelly. Oh how I could move!

(Gertrude does tap dance routine)

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**LULU:** Who's got the hook!

**GERTRUDE**: (She spins around) I still haven't lost my moves!

**LULU:** But you must have misplaced them. (She pulls Gertrude down)

SARAH: (Sarah Stands, Betsy Sits) Anyhow, he has a new act for us

today. Now, shall proceed with the business at hand...

**CRAIG:** Hey Steve, let's take a break from the meeting, I getting bored already! I could use some excitement...How about the bar next door.

STEVE: I'm in!

(Craig and Steve leave the meeting and walk over to far Stage Left)

#### **MEETING LIGHTS UP FULL**

(Just then the mood is suddenly interrupted by turmoil at the back of the Peggy Pounstone enters with her son Teddy in tow with all her luggage)

**PEGGY:** Excuse Me. Excuse ME. My name is Peggy Poundstone and I'm going to be the new tenant. I've got a few things I gotta check before moving in. Who's in charge here?

(Betsy sits down and points to Sarah)

**SARAH:** Can I help you? I'm the manager.

**PEGGY:** Well, I have a few things I want to say before I move in here.

**SARAH:** (*Said to Betsy*) Might as well give her a few minutes 'cause it doesn't look like she's going to listen to me anyway.

**PEGGY:** (to Sarah) Thanks, lady. First of all, I'm having packages delivered here before I move in. Just put them in YOUR office until my suite is ready. If that makes it too congested, just move your desk <u>out to the hall</u>. (Theodore walks in embarrassed behind his mother.) Oh, this is my son. (She motions to David, looks surprised and then motions to Teddy) This is my son, Teddy. He is here to help me measure the apartment for drapes. If you have any questions, ask me, NOT him.

**TEDDY:** But Mom, I can measure the drapes, and answer questions too.....

**PEGGY:** Ok, smarty pants. Tell me why....Why is the Sun Yellow and the Sky is Blue?

**TEDDY:** You know what I meant, I just want to help.

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**PEGGY:** No way.

**SARAH:** (*Temporarily overlooking Peggy's remarks*) Friends, I'd like you to meet the newest resident of Marblehead Manor. Er...aaa...I've forgotten your name...

**PEGGY:** It's <u>Peggy Poundstone</u>...and don't you ever forget it again! I'll be in Suite 777. It's on the top floor so I assume I'll be up there with the penthouse elite. It's a disappointment there's no swimming pool on the roof. I'm used to the very best accommodations. Stand back, Missy, let me tell you how it is:

SONG: "SUITE 777" (Peggy)

(Piano Roll intro) (Ethyl Merman – Everything coming up Roses style song)

(verse 1)

Your luck has gonna change Seven Seventy Seven I'm gonna turn this place To a Senior Living Heaven!

(verse 2)

It's not my only home in town Other places I could stay But hell, I'll take a shot right here Let the chips fall where they may!

(Chorus)

I am at that stage, don't want to act my age I want to live for the now It's a brand new start I need to open my heart Let's have fun, I'll show you how!

(Instrumental Break – 2 Measures)

(Bridge)
If I go to Suite Triple Seven
It will bring me luck I'm told

(Pause - 1 measure)

(Chorus)

I need to open my heart
Let's have fun, I'll show you how!

(Music End 4 bars)

**PEGGY:** While you're all here, I might as well give you some of MY ground rules... First of all, is there anyone here who has ever been in food service before retirement?

(LULU raises her hand in the audience)

**PEGGY:** Fine...excellent. You can bring up my meals. (*Pats LuLu on the head*) I'll expect my meals delivered promptly at 9 AM for breakfast, 1 PM for lunch and 6 PM for dinner

**GERTRUDE:** Dinner already? We just had breakfast!

**PEGGY:** (*Ignoring GERTRUDE*)...unless, of course, I'll be dining out. Note I said PROMPTLY! (*As she addresses the manager Sarah Sizemore*...) Ms. Sizemore, I know you are the manager here but I assume you must have a concierge. You MUST have! I'd like to speak

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with them now... (Hesitation) NOW!

**SARAH:** Ms. Poundstone (*Stands up*) MS. POUNDSTONE! You are about to set the world record for the shortest long-term lease in the entire history of senior living! I have a meeting to run here, so make an appointment to see my assistant Betsy Love and she'll clue you in on the do's and don'ts...IF you wish to live here...

**BETSY:** (*Heatedly pointing a finger at Peggy*) I'm NOT your concierge, But I will help you in any way I can.

**PEGGY:** (Looking at her list of things to do) Yah, yah...okay...okay...cool down (Ignoring the stern tone of the conversation) Now while I've got you all here, I have a few questions I'd like to have answered...and maybe the residents here would too. First of all, I hear that you have a little monthly newspaper...You'll all be thrilled to keep up on my comings and goings, so you Betsy you will need to find someone to be in charge of reporting on my social life.

**SARAH:** MS. POUNDSTONE! (She stands up and points to Peggy) You are outrageous, pugnacious and ostentatious!

**BETSY:** (*Pulls Sarah Down*) Maybe we should get her out of here.

**SARAH:** No, let her ramble on. She'll probably burn herself out and <u>expose herself</u> as a kook... (*Pause for a thought and then a quick smile*) Maybe I shouldn't use the words "<u>expose herself</u>" 'cause you never know.

**PEGGY:** You all are just going to have to realize, with me around here nothing is going to be the same.

LULU: You can say that again.

**DAVID:** Is "kook" with a "K" or a "C"?

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**SARAH:** Mr. D, Please don't write everything down.

**DAVID:** Got it.

**SARAH:** That'll do, Ms. Poundstone. Are you not aware that we're in the middle of a meeting here? Did I say middle? We have not even started!

**PEGGY:** Okay, okay. Just a few more things...then Theodore and I will be off to my room to measure for drapes.

(Meanwhile, Theodore "Ted" increasingly shows embarrassment with his mother's antics)

**SARAH:** You've got 3 minutes, and then you're outta here. (pointing at the back of the room) Any more than that and you're outta HERE! (a sweeping point indicating the entire residence)

**LULU:** All my kids were conceived in less than 3 minutes!

(Sarah gives Lulu the "Look")

**PEGGY:** Okay, I'll make it brief and to the point...

**DAVID:** Not likely.

**PEGGY:** My dog's name is Sissy but don't let her name fool you. I keep her for protection of my jewelry. She is **the** perfect watchdog for 7<sup>th</sup> Floor...even though she weighs only 8 pounds.

**GERTRUDE:** (to Lulu) 8 pounds is a big rabbit! (Lulu pats GERTRUDE on the back)

**PEGGY**: It's not a rabbit it's a dog.

**GERTRUDE:** Are you going to make it disappear?

**SARAH:** (pointing to her watch) You've got 2 minutes, Ms.

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Poundstone. (*Speaking Directly to Peggy*) I can't believe I'm giving you the floor.

**PEGGY:** (unfazed to Sarah) Blah, blah. I get it. (Spoken to the group) Now the last thing I need...better make that require...or even better, make it demand! You see, I love to dance, and most of my friends and suitors are not good dancers. Therefore I need someone in the building that can dance... I had a boyfriend 30 years ago and his dancing spoiled me. (Sighing) Oh, those were the days...those were really the days! Who is worthy of that assignment?

**LULU:** The great dancer you might be looking for is named Steve, but he's not here at the meeting. He's out with his pal Craig who is referred to in the building as the D.O.M.... Dirty Old Man. We see them together, A LOT. Kind of like Burt and Ernie thing, if you know what I mean.

**SARAH:** Cool down, LuLu! If I have want sarcasm, I would have called on you first.

**BETSY:** Now don't get the impression that it's all fun and games around here, Ms. Poundstone. We really care about our residents.

**SONG:** "THE PRESCRIPTION" (Betsy, Sarah with coffee cups)

(Irish Pub Song)

When things are going <u>not</u> so well And you're not up to <u>snuff</u> We offer this <u>prescription</u> When you are feeling <u>rough</u>...

This is the <u>best</u> prescription That <u>you</u> will ever see

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Don't <u>worry</u> 'bout the coverage 'Cause <u>this</u> advice is free...

(Music Pause-holding note)

Five milligrams of Laughter Ten milligrams of Love A capsule full of Kindness And some help from Above.

Capsules, gels or <u>pills</u>
They may do the <u>trick</u>
But for sure a little <u>TLC</u>
Helps when you are sick.

(Music Pause-holding note)

(Music Pause-holding note)

(Theodore "Ted" follows his mother toward the elevator center stage left, Teddy spreads his arms in embarrassment for her actions, the elevator doors open, Peggy and Teddy go in, doors close)

**BETSY:** (to Sarah) Are you going to be the one to tell her we don't allow drapes or am I?

**SARAH:** (*Spoken to Betsy*) Is she for real? Do you believe what just happened? Well, let's now all take a deep breath and re-start our meeting that, come to think of it, never really started.

**SARAH:** (She stands and taps her gavel times) Welcome once again to our Monthly Marblehead Manor Meeting at our peaceful, tranquil, calm and serene Marblehead Manor. On to New Business! First on the agenda...our Marblehead Manor Maintenance Man Matt Manning found dental plates in the lobby so if someone's been gumming it, here they are. (The teeth start chattering on the table)

**LULU:** Hey, those are mine! Good thing you found them, I'm using my back up set. And let me tell you it ain't pretty. (*Betsy dons plastic gloves and holding the teeth two-fingered takes the <u>clacking</u> teeth to her)* 

**SARAH:** Next order of business... our Maintenance Man also found an sealed envelope in the trash with your name on it, Mr. Derbyshire. Mr. Derbyshire? Mr. Derbyshire! WAKE UP!!

**DAVID:** What...what? Oh, I wasn't sleeping...just resting my eyes...yes, just resting my eyes. (*Obviously has been dozing*)

(Sarah pushes envelope to David)

**SARAH:** (*Tapping the gavel*) Okay, please can we try to stick to business? Bill the bus driver, wanted me to remind you that the bus for Ruby Tuesday comes on Friday, not to Fridays on Tuesday...Our thanks to Wilma Willis for the flower arrangement in the lobby...they are beauti... (*Suddenly there is a loud shriek from David Derbyshire*)

**DAVID**: I WON! I WON! (*Laughing*) This is the Ticket I have been looking for. I saw my winning numbers in the paper and but I could not find the ticket. **THE LOTTERY! **LULU:** (Just then LuLu jumps up from her seat, grabs a folding chair and sits next to Derbyshire who is seated on an end row seat) Mr. Derbyshire, let me help you with that...or may I call you David...or Dave? "Mrs. David Derbyshire". Hmm, that would have a certain ring to it...maybe an 18 carat ring. (She takes his ticket) 18 Carat RING! Let me touch that ticket to riches. 26-10-22-8-14-13. Are you sure those are the winning numbers?

**DAVID:** I always bet the same numbers twice a week, and I saw the winning numbers in the paper but could not find my ticket.

**LULU:** Well, you're going to have to check them again now that you've got the ticket. Why don't you go check it out? I'll be waiting right here for you to come back. They say money won't buy happiness...but if you have enough, you can rent it!

**DAVID**: This is it! I'M RICH! I have to go check these numbers right now

**LULU**: (*LuLu starts to return to Derbyshire's side*) Maybe I'll come with you...

**SARAH**: Stay down here, LuLu! I'm sure Mr. Derbyshire can use a financial planner, not an instantly new-found friend! Congratulations, Mr. D. I'll bet you are so very, very excited. Will you be staying for the rest of our meeting?

**DAVID**: Well, yes, I will stay so I can take notes. Then I will go up to my room to check the paper.

**CRAIG:** Hey Sarah! (Walks over to elevator by Sarah) You believe in the hereafter?

**SARAH:** What?

**CRAIG:** Then you know what I'm here after!

**TEDDY:** (Breaks in between the two) HEY! That's no way to treat a lady. Get out of here. (Turning to Sarah) Are you alright? (Craig sulks walking away)

**SARAH:** Yeah I'm Ok, I'm used to that kind a thing.

**TEDDY:** Well, <u>he crossed the line!</u> I'm glad I came down when I did. I was just up on the 7th floor helping my mother measure the room for drapes. I just had to get away. **BETSY:** Depends on what, Mr. Derbyshire?

**DAVID:** (*Sheepishly*) On my DEPENDS. I guess I got a little <u>too</u> excited. I better be leaving but I'll be back. I'll return a <u>changed</u> <u>man</u>...literally!

**SARAH:** Obviously there cannot be two winners. With that note, let's take a 15 minute nature break to clear up this mess. There is Lemonade and Pretzels in the little room back there. When we come back from the break, we will be pulling a new raffle ticket, so if you have not got your raffle ticket get one in the break room. I also have some important news to tell everyone when we return. Meeting is in recess for 15 minutes. (*Hits gavel one time*)

**LULU:** (*Hacks*) Any one got a ciggy? (*She tries to bum cigarettes from the audience*)

(Cast stays in character during intermission and interact with the audience)

**CRAIG:** (*Looking amazed*) Hello.....What? He did what? Derbyshire won 20 million dollars! 20 Million! Thanks. (*He hangs up the phone, turns to Steve*) 20 Million! Can you imagine what you could do with it?

**STEVE:** I wish I could have won that 20 years ago.

**CRAIG:** Yeah, when you would have had the body to enjoy it! Before your "schwing" got put into a "sling".

(Peg enters from the elevator)

### **ELEVATOR LIGHTS FADE UP FULL**

**STEVE:** That's for sure. (*He looks over at the lady by the elevator*) Peg? PEG? Is that you? It's me...Steve, Steve Girton. I just can't believe it. I was just talking about you today! Craig, this is the girl I have been talking about. It's been 30 years...30 years! Peg, it's great to see you. (*Pointing down*) Why are you here?

**PEGGY:** It's great to see you. (*Steve and Peg hug*) Well, it seems my son thinks it's time I find a smaller place. He thinks my time and money would be better spent if I stay someplace like this.

**STEVE:** Where have you been living?...your son?!

**PEGGY:** I've been all over this planet, but never really lived anywhere

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but in this town...(sigh) I just can't seem to get away from here.

**STEVE:** My, you look great!

(Craig looks bored, begins to whistle)

**PEGGY:** Thanks, my husband left me some money about ten years ago, so I've been able to get the regular facial, hairstyling, massage, manicure, pedicure, take a little off here (*motion toward rear end*) and put it on here (*motion to chest area*), you know the drill....

**STEVE:** You're husband left you?

**PEGGY:** Not exactly. He was a wealthy businessman, loved adventure, not too smart...going on a trip to swim with the sharks...not his best decision. He left me with my son Teddy, a couple houses and enough money to take care of both of us.

**STEVE:** And you're thinking of moving in here?

**PEGGY:** This place had good reviews, most places lock you up like a prison, and least at this place they'll let me come and go as I please. I plan a lot of coming and going.

**STEVE:** (*Realizing he has been ignoring Craig*) Where are my manners? Peg this is Craig.

(Peggy shakes his hand)

**CRAIG:** May I be the first to welcome you.

**PEGGY:** I introduced myself at the meeting earlier, and I may have come across a little forward.

**STEVE:** I never imagined I would see you again, especially here...

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**CRAIG:** Well, it ain't over till it's over! Guess I'll just slip back to the meeting and let you two, "old lovers" catch up. (*Craig leaves and returns to his seat in meeting*)

(Peggy and Steve walk over to Stage Left Center – Downstage)

**SONG:** "THIRTY YEARS / THIRTY MINUTES" (Peggy, Steve, Teddy, Sarah)

(Half spoken, half sung...)

(Steve and Peggy)

(Steve) Thirty Years, So long ago

(Peggy) Thirty Years, We let each other go (Steve) Thirty Years, We let it go so long

(*Peggy*) Thirty Years, How could we be so wrong

(Peggy) Husbands, wives and lovers gone

(Steve) We start again by moving on

(Peggy) The days go by I've lost the count

(Steve) The weeks and years they start to mount

(Peggy) To be honest I've relived those days

(Peggy) So many times so many ways

(Steve) We live life and don't know the cost

#### **HOUSE LIGHTS UP FULL**

#### **ELEVATOR LIGHTS UP FULL**

**BETSY:** (Very Excited and claps quickly as Sarah finishes her song)

Thank you, thank you, Sarah! And I want to thank Victor too.

**LULU:** Hey Victor, I'm CLEM's new agent, he wants out of his contract. He wants to go SOLO!

**SARAH:** Ok, Ok, I finally received the e-mail that I have been waiting for and I have a big announcement. Well, the owners of Marble Head Manor are selling the place!

(Audience is shocked)

**SARAH:** and in light of the changes, (pause) I have opted to leave.....

(A gasp from the audience members)

**BESTY:** (to Sarah) What do you mean leave....

**DAVID:** (*He rises excitedly*) POINT OF PARLIMENTARY

PROCEDURE! (Pause) May I speak, please?

**SARAH:** There is nothing you can say to make me change my mind.

**DAVID:** Try this on for size. I'm the new owner here at Marble Head Manor or as I like to now call it "Derbyshire Acres", and nobody is going anywhere!

**GERTRUDE:** What if I have to use the ladies room?

**LULU:** Just use the potted plants.

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**SARAH:** What?

CRAIG: Derbyshire, give LuLu back her bottle, you know that stuff

will kill you!

**STEVE:** What are you talking about David?

**DAVID:** I checked the newspaper and made some phone calls, I heard you and Betsy talking at the table before the meeting and heard about the budget problems. I'm the only winner of the lottery. I called the present owner of Marblehead Manor and as of and 15 minutes ago I own this establishment.

**LULU:** You bought Marblehead Manor with the lottery winnings? I was counting on marrying you and <u>me buying</u> time until you <u>bought</u> the farm....

**GERTRUDE:** Why would he buy a farm?

**DAVID:** Now I know I made the right decision! Sarah, I'd like you to stay! It would not be the same without you.

STEVE: Well, at least ask for a raise!

**SARAH:** Hold on, Hold on, I need a minute. This has happened so fast. Let me think about this. Victor can you please entert....(*pause*) Scratch that, Betsy could you entertain everyone for a minute, while I step out? (Sarah walks over by the elevator)

**BETSY:** Uhhh, Sure? (to the audience, looking totally startled, Pause) Does anybody have a request?

**CRAIG:** How about a strip tease?

**CLEM (VICTOR):** (Standing Up) How about you and Sarah?

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**PEGGY:** I wouldn't put it past her!

**SARAH:** OK, That's it. The gloves are coming off.....

(Peggy and Sarah go center stage with evil looks, toward each other, Teddy hides his face, Steve gets in between them)

**STEVE:** Ladies, we can work this out.

**CLEM (VICTOR):** There are only two ways to settle this, face to face, or bikini's and mud....

VICTOR: ....Or Jell-O!

**BETSY:** Put a sock in it Victor, (*pause*) and Clem!

**STEVE:** (*To Peggy*) Hold it Peg! Just slow things down. I know why Sarah riles you up. But don't you see..... She is you! 30 years ago. That, passion for life. That, Seize the day attitude, how you live life to the fullest. I see it in her...like I see it in you. Don't keep them apart like our parents keep us apart!

**PEGGY:** Steve, I'm not convinced that girl is right for my Theodore.

**STEVE:** Peg, It's OK, let your Ted live his own life and you and I will live ours.

**PEGGY:** I know, but he's all I've had for years and I only want the best for him.

**STEVE:** Well, now you've got me. Take me and let him go!

**SARAH:** Ms. Poundstone, I know you love your son, I love him too. From working here, I can see how precious and short life is. I will take good care of him. (*Sarah winks at Ted*)

**PEGGY:** Go easy on my Teddy, I spent too much money on this body

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to be a grandmother.

**STEVE:** (to Peggy) You have me to worry about now.

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### Act 2, Scene 4

LULU: They need to get a room!

**GERTRUDE:** Why would they do that, they already have a place to

stay.

**LULU:** Gerty, didn't you see them singing to each other earlier?

**GERTRUDE:** I thought that was just part of the show!

(Lulu shakes her head, Sarah returns to her seat)

**SARAH:** Thank you Mr. Derbyshire, I have decided to stay. I couldn't leave this place.

(Audience applauds)

**DAVID:** Please call me David and of course you will get a raise!

**CRAIG:** Why would anyone want to leave this place?

**LULU:** The only people who leave this place, leave horizontal out the back door.

**GERTRUDE:** Is it over?

**CRAIG:** That's why I always say....it ain't over till it's over.

SONG: "IT AIN'T OVER TILL IT'S OVER" (Craig & Chorus)

(Craig says the first line of the verse and one of the cast members interrupts him to finish the verse)

(Music Intro 4 bars)

**LULU:** Oh, Great, now there probably going to sing another song! I'm never getting out of here!

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(CRAIG) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (STEVE)Though we <u>don't</u> move very fast Look <u>forward</u> to tomorrow
Not dwell upon the past!

(CRAIG)It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (PEGGY)Still <u>much</u> for us to see We've <u>always</u> been too busy Now our time is free!

(Brief Orchestration)

(CRAIG) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (LULU)If we <u>take</u> our pills

Wash them down with laughter
Too soon to read our wills!

(CRAIG) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Prompts audience with 1st line) (GERTRUDE)No <u>time</u> for us to part
There <u>is</u> so much to live for
If we're young at heart!

(Brief Orchestration)

(CRAIG) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Audience joins in 1st line) (VICTOR) What <u>makes</u> our lives worthwhile Is <u>making</u> others happy With a <u>kind</u> word and a <u>smile</u>!

(CRAIG) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Audience joins in 1st line) (ALL)As we <u>take</u> our pills

Wash them down with laughter
Too <u>soon</u> to read our wills!

(Brief Orchestration)

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(ALL CAST) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Audience joins in) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Audience joins in) It ain't <u>over</u> till it's over (Audience joins in) (ending notes...like a cha-cha-cha)

**SARAH:** So, if anyone has anymore business....

**LULU:** Or Songs?

**GERTRUDE:** I told you it was a Musical. I don't know why you insist on calling this a meeting?

**SARAH:** Seeing none and hearing none, I will accept a motion to end the meeting.

**GERTRUDE:** I don't see any nuns.

**LULU:** There are nuns?

**CRAIG:** So Moved.

**SARAH:** And a Second.

LULU: Second. Please let it end!

**SARAH:** All those in favor of ending the meeting say "I"

(Audience says "I")

**SARAH:** Opposed same sign.

**GERTRUDE:** I, I want to hear another song!

**SARAH:** Motioned carries. Meeting adjourned. (*Hits Gavel, Lulu, Gertrude, David, Peg, Teddy, Steve, Craig start to pick up their stuff and leave. Sarah says to Teddy*) Ok, Gerty, you get your wish, Betsy let's

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our song one more time!

#### **Curtain Call**

**SONG:** "THE PRESCRIPTION" (Reprise)

**SARAH:** I can't wait to move in together.

**TED:** We are going to move in with Mom, Right?

**ALL LIGHTS OUT (5 Seconds)**
